Former United Exec Takes Loss in Kenilworth

A former chief financial officer at United Continental Holdings Inc. recently sold a six-bedroom Georgian in north suburban Kenilworth for \$3.25 million, 10.6 percent less than what he paid last year, according to county records. Zane Rowe, who left United Continental this year to be vice-president of sales at Apple Inc., did not return messages left through an Apple spokesman. The home on Kenilworth Avenue was built in 1924, sits a few blocks from Lake Michigan and features a wine cellar and coach house for guests,

according to a listing. Hunter Andre of Coldwell Banker Residential Brokerage, who represented buyers James C. Hunt and Ana Ochoa, said his clients moved from Chicago and were attracted to Kenilworth public schools.
