Real Estate Exec Sells Lincoln Park Home

A real estate executive sold a Lincoln Park mansion for nearly \$3.3 million.

Chris Hunt, chief executive with Hunt Cos. of El Paso, Texas, and his wife, Ana, sold the six-bedroom, 4½-bath home last month, according to public records. Chris Hunt declined to comment.

The 6,400-square-foot home on Cleveland Avenue was built in 2007 with a brick and limestone exterior, according to the listing on Redfin, a national brokerage. It has walnut floors, an elevator, three terraces and a roof deck over the garage.

The home sold for less than the \$3.4 million it fetched in 2011, according to county records. The

slightly lower price reflects increased competition from a rising number of newly constructed homes in the same price range in Lincoln Park, said the listing agent, Hunter Andre of Coldwell Banker.

“If someone can buy a brand spanking new home for \$3.4 or \$3.5 million they’re going to gravitate towards that,” he said. The Hunts sold their home because Chris Hunt’s job was moved to Texas, he said. Hunt is a national development firm.

Buyers Ashok and Catherine Jagasia were represented by Emily Sachs Wong of @properties. Neither Wong nor the Jagasias responded to requests for comment.
